

Modern Knot

SWAP Ingredients: Background fabric – 5 FQ low volume prints with a light background
Knot fabric – 5 FQ bright prints

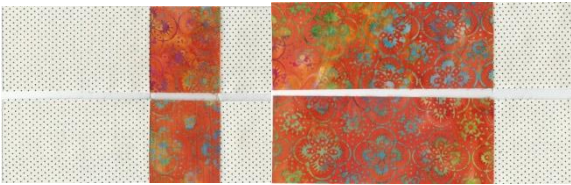
Terminology: **Fabric Combo** – set of blocks made of identical fabrics
Pinned group – one block from each Fabric combo, pinned together

What to make: A modern knot block, using 1 background fabric and 1 bright print fabric

End Result: 35 blocks, consisting of 5 Fabric Combos with 7 blocks each
(After the trade, you will receive 30 blocks, enough for a quilt 40x48)
Blocks are 8-1/2" unfinished

Cutting Instructions: For each Fabric Combo:
From the background FQ, cut (7) 2.5" x 20" strips,
then sub-cut each strip into (4) 2.5" squares and (2) 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles.
From the bright knot FQ, cut (7) 2.5" x 20" strips,
then sub-cut each strip into (2) 2.5" squares and (2) 2.5" x 6.5" rectangles.

Sewing Instructions: For each block, construct 2 identical strips, each consisting of a 2.5" x 4.5" background rectangle, sewn to a 2.5" bright square, and then to a 2.5" background square.
Make 2 more identical strips, each consisting of a 2.5" background square sewn to a 2.5" x 6.5" bright rectangle.
Assemble the block as shown below.

**Pinning Instructions:**

Put **your name** on 7 small pieces of paper.

You should have 5 Fabric Combo stacks, with 7 blocks each.

Take 1 block from each Fabric Combo, then either pin or baste a name tag onto the left corner of this group.

This is a pinned group that will be swapped.

Put all 5 pinned groups into a gallon Ziploc bag that **has your name on it.**

Run short of a fabric? It's okay to substitute a fabric that does not appear in another Fabric Combo.

Second bag of blocks? Use ALL different fabrics.

One pinned group per bag will be donated to OVQG for a fundraising auction.

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
